


FIGURE 1 CORPORATE ORGANIZATION

13.2 Automated Graphics Interface

Corporate managers and planners use computers to manage information ranging from industrial engineering studies and financial projections to personnel production statistics, management and organizational structures. Once the user has the computerized information he needs to review it, present it, discuss it and decide how to act on it. One of the fastest and most efficient mediums for sharing information is a graphic presentation with charts and diagrams. Recent studies indicate that the human brain absorbs information 40,000 times faster in graphic form than in written form.

AMCI can support project tasks with interactive graphics and input and output compatibility. AMCI own and operate multiple hardware and software systems and can therefore take data from contributing organizations and quickly mold it into one document using our IBM PC, Xerox 320, TMS-3000, Zenith 100, Zenith 151, Columbia 1600 and Leading Edge PC, all of which are interfaced. Data prepared in text, numeric and financial tables within the organization can be used to produce graphics on AMCI compatible hardware and software systems and be in the users hands within the hour.

At AMCI we use IBM PC micro processors incorporating color graphics monitors to display, review and modify presentations. The resultant graphics displays are then captured on hard copy in two possible formats; color graphics plotted on bond paper or overhead transparency, and 35mm color slides or prints. These graphics images are produced using commercially available Hewlett-Packard and Polaroid instruments integrated with the micro processors.

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The Hewlett Packard (HP-7475A) instrument is a computer plotter that plots on either eight and one-half by eleven or twelve and one-half by seventeen inch bond paper on clear transparency media. The HP has a resolution of one-thousand-dot-per-inch and its lines are smooth, not jagged, and at eight lines per centimeter. A graphics integrated with IBM PC software packages, the user is able to produce hard copy graphs or transparencies for slides.

The Polaroid Corporation Video color printer is a high speed color printer of 25mm slides. Color resolution is 12 bits per pixel and therefore is one-third the resolution of the monitor. It generates images with a resolution of up to 1024 x 128 pixels with 72 colors. It can work with disk-based graphics interface and it contains its own monochrome CRT and color CRT used to generate color pictures.

13.3 Report Production Facilities

AMCI maintains a complete, state-of-the-art production facility. The equipment consists of two simple sheet feeders, a sheet feed text page copier for up to 15 copies, and a multi-page multi-copy Xerox capable of automatically feeding up to 50 copies of source document and providing 15 collated copies per run.

Reports of less than two inches thickness can be bound using our GBC Binding Machine which prepares reports bound in the same manner as this proposal. Larger reports should be 3-hole drilled by our drill-press and presented in 3-ring binders.

13.4 Data Gathering Techniques

In order to fully execute the technical approach, reference data germane to tasking under this RFP must be made machine readable. A variety of source media are likely, ranging from hard copy files to machine readable data files. AMCI will use the following methods to build machine readable data files.

If the source data is in micro processor machine readable form, then the AMCI technical research staff will translate the data file to a standard PC format. At AMCI we have the capability to

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translate data files produced on a variety of microprocessor systems, to a standard PC format.

If the source data is resident on a microprocessor, tape or disk can be used. If the large media system has serial port capability, the AMCI staff will utilize our microprocessor serial communications protocol to access the mainframe. The file will then be downloaded to a standard PC format. A record will then be produced a 1600 bpi, 9 track cartridge tape containing all the applicable data. This data tape can then be mounted on a microprocessor tape drive and downloaded to PC format.

Some of the data that will be needed to complete tasks will be in hard copy files. This data source will be of two types, data that can be copied and removed from the source, and data that can not for some reason be copied. AMCI has techniques to handle both data types.

The AMCI research staff will utilize the OMNIREADER to read and type printed material into our microprocessors. OMNIREADER, developed by OBERON International, will read and convert documents thru its optical character reader to machine readable form, by utilizing the RS232C interface. This data will then be reformatte to be PC compatible.

Over the years AMCI has tried various methods of capturing data that can not be copied. One method that has proven successful is the use of dictation tape recorders and carefully worked out oral formats. The format indicates the sequence in which numbers will be dictated onto the tape. This format nine specifies rules for pronunciation of the digits; the way in which a break is signified; and the shift to a new record. The researcher goes to the source and finds the necessary information and enters it into the dictation file. This method has proven to be faster and more accurate than hand written or key entry. It also allows the researcher to minimize the amount of on-site time, and provides a faster interface. This dictated file will then be entered into a PC data file.

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13.5 Security Provisions

The Defense Contract Administration Service, Region (OCONUS) has recently conducted a site inspection of AMCI. Our corporate facilities have received an Industrial Clearance to handle SECRET material. Because of our work load with various Departments of Defense organizations, all of our professional staff have current security clearances. Our Security Procedures Manual contains step-by-step instructions for the handling of classified material.

15.0 SUPPORT STAFF

AMCI corporate policy strictly prohibits the direct allocation of support staff costs to contract services performed.

The AMCI Support Staff is a part of our DCAA Audit Overhead Expenses. AMCI has never, in it's eighteen years of performing on U.S. Government contracts, proposed to directly apply support staff hours nor performed by Direct Application of support staff hours on any contract.

Recently, 19 December 1985, AMCI was informed by the NKC contracting officer that certain labor categories must be proposed by bidders for each and every labor category and the number of hours estimated by the procurement procuring.

AMCI intends to be responsive to the government's procurement requirements. AMCI will propose actual values for the support staff labor categories and the increased organization cost will be reflected in the AMCI overhead where it's not efficient to actually be experienced. In other words, one AMCI support staff currently performs duties such as preparing a contract deliverable report, recording her labor hours on an overhead account, will, under the terms of the contract resulting from this procurement, record those labor hours against the AMCI Direct Cost number for the particular contract; thereby reducing the indirect overhead dollars required to support the contract, dollar for dollar of direct cost.


