
Dear Congressman Coughlin:



Dear Ms. Dunn:

This letter is the follow-up to your telephone conversation with my Aunt, Mrs. David (Barbara) Waitz concerning the possible position of employment for me with the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (USNRC).

My background is a bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering obtained in 1970, undergraduate work in Biology in the late 1970's and a Masters degree in Biology in 1985. I have worked in electronics since 1971; the first year (1970) I was very ill and unable to work for 5 months after graduation. My career has included work in instrumentation in the security systems/fire/smoke detector industry and 11 years in the medical electronics field. In August of this year my last employer lost project funding and informed that a layoff was imminent. Since August I have been actively seeking a new position; I lost my job in mid September. As I am over 40 years of age, finding a new position in uncertain economic times is quite difficult. I am willing to move my household and alter my career objectives and direction in my search for adequate and reasonable employment.

I attended a career fair sponsored by The Career Connection PO Box 130 Sullivan Island, SC 29482 (803) 884-7123 at the Guest Quarters Hotel in Plymouth Meeting, Pa. on October 31, 1990. At the fair I met with Mr. Jim Shaffner (301-492-3450) of the USNRC and Mr. Frank Elizondo (301) 492-9027 or (800) 368-5642 ext 29027 of the personnel group at the USNRC. Mr. Shaffner is with the nuclear waste management group. He expressed interest in my background for his group and kept one copy of my resume for later review.

During the career fair interview a second copy of my resume was requested for consideration by the instrumentation electronics engineering people. It was indicated that my microprocessor and digital electronics experience would be of use; they were looking for people with my knowledge and background. Therefore I am under consideration by two different groups. I was told to call Jim Shaffner in one week.

When I called, I was told that Mr. Elizondo was away; Mr. Shaffner later returned my call to his office. He informed me of his decision to forward my resume to his management for consideration. Mr. Shaffner indicated continued interest. That is the state of my

application to date.

I asked for assistance here as I am very interested in this position and I am trying to find a more stable career position.

Please except my most heartfelt thanks for everything and anything you can do to help me in these matters.
