This letter is the follow-up to your telephone conversation with my Aunt, Mrs. David (Barbara) Waitz concerning the possible position of employment for me with the United State Nuclear Regulatory Commission (USNRC).

My background is a bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering obtained in 1970, undergraduate work in Biology in the late 1970's and a Masters degree in Biology in 1985.
