Subject:

NRC SENIOR MANAGEMENT SURVEY OF THE IMPACT OF NRC ACTIVITIES ON THE SAFE OPERATION OF NUCLEAR POWER PLANTS

Purpose:

To inform the Commission of a proposed NRC Senior Management Survey of the impact of NRC activities on the safe operation of nuclear power plants.

Background:


There has been some feedback from industry that NRC generic and site specific activities may be tending in a direction such that the desired safety effects may not be realized. This is especially true in light of additional oversight activities by other organizations such as INPO, Insurance inspectors, States, etc.

Planned Survey:

A team of approximately five senior NRC managers from the regions and NRR, led by A. Bert Davis, Regional Administrator, Region-III will conduct the servey. The survey will include 15 utilities from 5 regions. Two to three representative utilities from each region will be selected for the survey. The survey is tentatively scheduled to start in September 1989 and expected to be completed in November 1989.

The overall approach of this survey is to hold discussions with representatives of several utilities to obtain

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information on the impact of NRC activities. Discussion will be held on an individual utility basis and include senior and middle level corporate management, site management and site operators and supervisors. Typical topics of discussion are as follows:

Increase in requirements from IQ

Increased team inspection and impact on plant staff
 Perception that NRC and INPO are competing to be tough
 Inconsistency between HQ and Regions on definition of

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Inspectors increasing standards for acceptability

 Total regulatory/oversight impact on utility performance

Conflicting requirements between oversight/regulatory organization

A composite report will be issued without attribution to any specific utility or individual. The report will contain findings from the revey and will be from the team leader (A. Davis) to the extor, NRR (T. Murley). The Commission will be provided with a copy of the report.
