

Dear Mr. Pouse:

In your letter of March 30, 1989, you requested that Sequoyah Fuels Corporation (SFC) submit an evaluation of alternatives to mitigate or eliminate the buildup of contamination in the sediment and soil along the effluent stream for Outfall 001.

SFC has reviewed the situation and does not see a reasonable alternative to the original pipeline concept. Therefore, SFC will commit to installing an Outfall 001 pipeline from its present outfall sampling point downstream to the boundary of the Corps of Engineers (Corps) property. Furthermore, SFC will make another attempt to gain an easement to continue the pipeline over Corps property to the headwaters of the Robert S. Kerr Reservoir.
