Gentlemen:

At the time of Mr. Zurakowski's inspection Larry Johnson was conferring with the construction site foreman as to test requirements. Mr. Johnson states that he was at no time out of visual contact with the instrument. Mr. Johnson observed Mr. Zurakowski looking into the vehicle, and since he had visual contact at all times did not question Mr. Zurakowski's activities.

Mr. Johnson was travelling between several construction sites on Ft. Wainwright, and admits he was remiss in securing the gauge properly during transport. All of our technicians have been counseled on this matter.

The shipping paper in Mr. Johnson's vehicle had been abused to the point that it was unreadable. This has been corrected by placing the documents inside clear plastic document covers.

In addition to the above steps we are going to be constructing cabinets for our vehicles. The cabinets will be secured to the vehicle, and have a hasp, and padlock on it's door. This will be accomplished by the end of October 1989.
