Dear Ms. Marshall:

In our letter dated August 15, 1988, Kerr-McGee informed the NRC of the pending sale of Sequoyah Puels Corporation to General Atomics. This sale does not include the Cimarron Facility which is currently being decommissioned.

This is to revise the previous correspondence to note that license and management oversight for the Cimarron Facility will be done under Cimarron Corporation (an Oklahoma Corporation), a wholly owned subsidiary of Kerr-McGee Corporation. We, therefore, request that License Condition 1 of the referenced license be revised to read:

## 1. Cimarron Corporation

All other conditions of the license will remain the same and Cimarron Corporation will be responsible for all obligations of, and operations performed under License 35-12636-02.

An agreement has been reached with General Atomics for the purchase of the stock of Sequoyah Fuels Corporation, including the Sequoyah Conversion Facility located near Gore, Oklahoma (NRC License SUB-1010). The Cimarron Facility, previously part of Sequoyah Fuels Corporation, will not be transferred to General Atomics. Kerr-McGee Corporation will retain the license and management oversight for the Cimarron Facility. The announcement of the sale of Sequoyah Fuels is attached for your information.

We therefore request that the Cimarron Byproduct Material License, No. 35-12636-02, be transferred to Kerr-McGee Corporation. License Conditions 1 and 2 should be revised to read:

All other conditions of the license will remain the same and Kerr-McGee Elver Corporation will be responsible for all obligations of, and operations performed under License 35-12636-02.

OKLAHOMA CITY -- Kerr-McGee Corp. and General Atomics today signed a definitive agreement under which General Atomics will acquire the common stock of Sequoyah Fuels Corp., a subsidiary of Kerr-McGee. The transfer of ownership is expected to take place when the required regulatory approvals are granted.

Sequoyah Fuels is engaged primarily in uranium conversion operations in eastern Oklahoma.

General Atomics (formerly GA Technologies) is a privately owned, advanced technology and scientific consulting company based in San Diego, Calif. The company's operations include defense contracting, fusion energy research, and manufacturing of nuclear test reactors and nuclear reactor fuel.

An agreement in principle for this acquisition was announced in November 1987.

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
