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83 1 intentions to review the way you normally review operations, 2 and we'll keep you informed through the region as to where we stand and make the packages available. 3 MR. BROWN: Okay. If there are any members of 4 the public that would like to make a statement at this time, 5 6 please come forward and identify yourself and please speak 7 into the microphone here. Yes. 8 9 MR. MCGRANNERY: James P. McGrannery, Jr. My affiliation was given earlier. 10 11 I'd like to address my comments to the staff. I was very encouraged at the beginning of the 12 meeting when Dr. Murley said that the staff was not going to 13 be allowing piecemeal decommissioning. Very positive. 14 However, we then had a presentation in which the 15 licensee outlined three categories of equipment that it is 16 going to be making our systems. It is going to be putting 17 away in storage a third of the plant's operating systems. 18 It then detailed a procedure that it had for deciding how to .19 mothball or store these systems. 20 Gentlemen, that's piecemeal decommissioning. 21 That's what you said you weren't going to allow. 22 23 And Dr. Murley also said that not until this day had he seen those categories of equipment or systems. You 24 25 asked some questions about some of them, As to what this

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difference is between operational and functional. You were
given some information about some of them.

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There's no reason why you can't ask, order, the licensee to deliver the particular evaluations of all of those systems to you so that at this very sensitive stage you can make your own independent judgment of whether they are being properly categorized and maintained.

8 Finally, I would like to mention a word that I did 9 not hear. It's called NEPA, "National Environmental Policy 10 Act.

Il I know that last year you amended your rules to not require an Environmental Impact Review of every reactor decommissioning. Your basis for that was a **puip** which considered as its basis that the reactor had either reached the end of its operating life through age, or the end of its operating life through accident. It did not consider this case.

18 This is a case where we have a brand new reactor .19 and therefore one of the alternatives to be considered is 20 operation. Whether LILCO operates it or not is a separate 21 question. And whether LILCO's characterisation of its 22 agreement as being second stone is correct nor not is a 23 separate question.

24 I think that you need to do an environmental 25 review before you allow this decommissioning to go forward.

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Thank you very much.

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DR. MURLEY: Okay. Let me respond very briefly. 2 I don't want to get into extended dialogue. But I think the 3 comments are good and I think they deserve an answer. 4 The first comment was the three categories of 5 One category of which is the preservation group of 6 systems. systems where the utility is developing lay-up procedures. 7 We do not regard that as piecemeal 9 decommissioning. In fact, the whole purpose of the lay up is to make sure that they are maintained operational and 10 that they can be restored to service if that's planned. 11 12 Your second point was that we had not seen the categories of the systems today and there is no reason that 13 14 we could not -- I guess your point is no reason that we have 15 to accept that category or that we could not change it. 16 That's quite true. We do intend to review all the categorization of the three types of systems, operational, 17 functional and protected. And we'll satisfy ourselves that 18 those are the appropriate list of systems in those 19 20 categories. With regard to NEPA, I should say that, of course, 21 22 any request for a licensing action or a change in the licenses will trigger certain NEPA functions. 23 I'll ask my counsel if there are any other 24 comments on that matter. 25

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MR.
