Response to "Notice of Violation" dated September 13, 1989.

The following corrective actions have been taken:

- 1. Effective October 1, 1989, a daily measurement of the cobalt-57 standard activity is being made using the dose calibrator Tc-99m setting, as well as the Co-57 setting. Tc-99m accounts for over 90-percent of all radiopharmaceutical activity assayed with this dose calibrator.
- 2. The diagnostic misadministration referred to in this violation was reported using the appropriate USNRC misadministration form and filed in the facility records. There was no record of this report being filed with the NRC office. Effective immediately, we will submit misadministration reports by certified mail, and in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR Part 35 concerning misadministration reports.
