SUBJECT: PRAIRIE ISLAND NUCLEAR GENERATING PLANT UNIT NOS 1 AND 2. SAFETY EVALUATION FOR ITEM 2.2 (PART 1) OF GENERIC LETTER 83-28. EQUIPMENT CLASSIFICATION (PROGRAMS FOR ALL SAFETY-RELATED COMPONENTS) (TAC NOS. 53705 AND 53706)

Generic Letter 83-28 was issued by the NRC On July 8, 1983 to specify actions to be taker by licensees and applicants based on the generic implications of the Salem ATWS events. Item 2.2 (Part 1) of that letter states that licensees and applicants shall describe in considerable detail their program for classifying and identifying all safety-related components, other than Reactor Trip System (RTS) components, as safety-related on plant documents and in information handling systems that are used to control plant activities that may affect these components. Specifically, the licensee's/applicant's submittal was required to contain information describing (1) the criteria used to identify these components as safety-related: (2) the information handling system which identifies the components as safety-related; (3) the manner in which station personnel use this information handling system to control activities affecting these components; (4) management controls that are used to verify that the information handling system is prepared, maintained, validated, and used in accordance with approved procedures; and (5) design verification and qualification testing requirements that are part of the specifications for procurement of safety-related components.

Your response to Generic Letter 83-28, Item 2.2 (Part 1) was forwarded to the NRC staff by letters dated November 4, 1983, and March 31, 1987 describing your program for identifying and classifying safety-related equipment other than RTS components. We have evaluated your program and concluded that it is acceptable. A copy of our Safety Evaluation is enclosed. Our conclusion is based on our contractor's report (EGG-NTA-7422), (April 1987), which is attached to the Safety Evaluation.
