Dear Chairman Carr:

I wholeheartedly support your position to establish Plant Life Extension for nuclear power plants as a top priority activity at NRC. Yankee has been working on life extension for almost two years. As you are undoubtedly aware, Yankee intends to submit an application for a license extension in June of 1991, less than two years away. We have made enormous progress to date on satisfyir for another 20 years. We continue to brief NRC staff on our methodology and progress. Thus far, we see no major obstacles

The difficulties apparent to us at this point involve the licensing process. A final rule governing license renewal is not even scheduled to be available until almost one year after our intended filing date. Also, unless the licensing process is straightforward, focused and specifies issues subject to review, establishes strict schedules for both the NRC and the hearing process, we can expect the same lack of interest in Plant Life Extension as we see in new nuclear plant orders.

I am very encouraged by your personal interest in this matter. If I can be of any help in assisting in the development of a licensing process that is functional, please let me know.
