Dear Mr. Barnett:

Your recent letter to the President concerning thermal effects on Lake Erie of the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Plant has been sent to the Atomic Energy Commission for response.

With regard to your comment on lake effects, I am sending you a report on thermal and ecological studies and research projects which have been sponsored by the Commission and the industry. In addition to the projects mentioned in the enclosed booklet, "Nuclear Power and the Environment" many other programs have been initiated and a substantial body of knowledge has been accumulated since publication of this report.

In regard to your suggestion concerning cooling towers, the utility recently announced that a closed cycle cooling system will be installed for the Davis-Besse Plant at a cost of about \$9 Million.

You may also be interested in another related booklet, "Licensing of Power Reactors" which describes our program for protecting the health and safety of the public.
