

Dear Senator Saxbe:

Thank you for providing us an opportunity to respond to Miss Debbie Henry's inquiry concerning the nuclear power plant to be built near Sandusky.

Miss Henry is most likely referring to the proposed Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station at Port Clinton, Ohio, proposed as a joint undertaking by Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company and Toledo Edison Company. The plant would be located on the southwestern shore of Lake Erie approximately 21 miles east of Toledo and would supply electricity to the northern Ohio area.

The regulatory staff of the Commission (AEC) has completed its evaluation of the application to construct and operate this facility. The notice of hearing on the application, a copy of which is enclosed, has been published in the Federal Register. The AEC's safety review and reactor licensing procedures are explained in the enclosed pamphlet, "Licensing of Power Reactors."

With respect to possible thermal effects of nuclear power plant operations, Toledo Edison Company announced on July 31, 1970, that the plant would use a closed cycle cooling tower system. The company expects only a limited discharge of water containing waste heat from the plant.

The Water Quality Act of 1965 provides a program through which water quality standards are developed by the States and approved by the Secretary of the Interior. Under this program, the Secretary of the Interior would approve water quality standards for Lake Erie.

Further, the recently enacted Water Quality Improvement Act of 1970 requires applicants for a construction permit and operating license for any nuclear power plant which would discharge effluents into the navigable waters of the U.S. to provide the AEC with certification from the State or interstate pollution control agency, or the Secretary of the Interior, as appropriate, that there is reasonable assurance that the plant will not violate applicable water standards. The AEC would generally be prohibited from issuing any such permit or license without having received this certification.

I am enclosing for Miss Menry's information a copy of our detailed environmental statement for the Davis-Messe plant which was prepared in accordance with the Mational Environmental Policy Act of 1969. The statement includes the comments and recommendations of other Federal agencies concerning the plant, and the water quality aspects of the plant are discussed on pages 11 to 16 of the statement.

Under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, each Mederal agency is required to consult with appropriate Federal, State, and local agencies concerning major Federal actions significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and to prepare a detailed statement concerning, among other things, the environmental impact of the proposed action. An environmental report has been prepared by the Toledo Edison Company for the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station. A copy of the report has been sent to the Governor and the Council on Environmental Quality, and has been made available to appropriate Federal, State, and local agencies for comment. After the conclusion of the comment period, the regulatory staff will prepare a detailed environmental statement which will include a discussion of any problems or objections raised and the disposition thereof. Copies of the statement will be forwarded to the Council and the agencies concerned and will accompany the application through the Commission's review process.
