Dear Mr. Minshall:

This is in reply to your March 9, 1971 letter which enclosed a letter from Mrs. Ruth Berzins concerning the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station near Port Clinton, Ohio.

In response to a number of inquiries on the Davis-Besse plant, we have prepared a summary which describes the proceedings concerned with the licensing of the plant, and the controls that the AEC will have over the plant during its lifetime. I am enclosing a copy of the summary for Mrs. Berzins' information.

In addition, Mrs. Berzins may be interested in the enclosed detailed statement of environmental considerations associated with the construction and operation of the Davis-Besse plant. This detailed statement was prepared by the AEC regulatory staff as required by the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969.


