I have been contacted by the above-mentioned constituent regarding questions he has concerning the Three Mile Island nuclear incident.

- 1. Was there a pressure spike or explosion within the containment chamber anytime during the accident? If so, was the stress factor 30 psi? Was hydrogen involved in the explosion?
- What is the design strength of containment? 60 psi has been given as a measurement - is that common to most other reactors?
