POSSIBLE AMENDMENTS TO "IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS" RULE

AGENCY: U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission

ACTION: Extension of Period for Public Comment on Proposed  
Rulemaking

SUMMARY: The availability of and a request for public comments on a proposed rulemaking concerning possible amendments to 10 CFR Parts 2 and 50, the Commission's "immediate effectiveness" rule, was noticed in the Federal Register on May 22, 1980 (45 FR 34279). The original comment period expired on July 7, 1980. A request for an extension of the comment period has been received, and the comment period has been extended to July 21, 1980.

DATE: Comment period, as extended, expires July 21, 1980.



SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On May 22, 1980, the Commission published a notice in the Federal Register (45 FR 34279) requesting comments by July 7, 1980 on a proposed rulemaking concerning possible amendments to the Commission's "immediate effectiveness" rule. On

July 6, 1980, Mr. Malcolm H. Philips, Jr. requested a two-week extension of the comment period to July 21, 1980. The Secretary of the Commission, under the authority contained in 10 CFR 2.808, has granted Mr. Philips' request. Accordingly, the time for interested persons to submit written comments to Mr. Samuel J. Chilk, Secretary, United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, D.C. 20555, has been extended to July 21, 1980.
