Boston Edison Co. has been given 30 days to either pay the proposed fine or to request in writing that part or all of it be withdrawn, giving its reasons for any such request. The company also has been given 30 days to admit or deny the alleged violations, to give its reasons for them if admitted, then described the actions it has taken or plans to take to prevent their happening in the future, and to give the date by which it expects to be in full compliance with NRC requirements.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts has been informed of this proposed enforcement action.

NRC STAFF TO MEET WITH PUBLIC SERVICE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE AT 7 P.M.,
SEPTEMBER 6, AT UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, TO DISCUSS THE JUNF 22
INCIDENT AT THE SEABROOK NUCLEAR PLANT

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff has scheduled a public meeting with officials of Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH) for 7 p.m. on September 6, 1989, to discuss the findings of an NRC Augmented Inspection Team (AIT) that looked into events surrounding the conduct of a natural circulation test at PSNH's Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant on June 22, 1989.

The meeting will be held in the Great Bay Room of the New England Center of the University of New Hampshire at 15 Strafford St., Durham, NH.

The first 90 minutes of the meeting will be devoted to a discussion among NRC and PSNH officials, after which elected officials and members of the public will be given an opportunity to provide comments to the NRC staff on the NRC's inspection and the adequacy of the utility's corrective actions.
