NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Young Wireline Service, Inc.

As a result of the inspection conducted on August 24, 1989, and in accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C (Enforcement Policy) (1989), the following violation was identified:


License Condition 10 states that licensed material may be stored at the licensee's facilities in Dunbar, West Virginia; Parkersburg, West Virginia; Wooster, Ohio; and Bradford, Pennsylvania.

Contrary to the above, on August 24, 1989, the licensee stored licensed material at the Buckhannon, West Virginia Field Station, an unauthorized storage location.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Young Wireline Service, Inc., is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555, with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region II, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice. This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include [for each violation]: (1) admission or denial of the violation, (2) the reason for the violation if admitted, (3) the corrective steps which have been taken and the results achieved, (4) the corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further violations, and (5) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order may be issued to show cause why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken.
