

Gentlemen:

This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. D. J. Perrotti of this office on October 11-19, 1977, of activities authorized by NRC Operating License Nos. DPR-38, DPR-47 and DPR-55 for the Oconee Units 1, 2 and 3 facilities, and to the discussion of our findings held with Mr. R. M. Koehler at the conclusion of the inspection.

Areas examined during this inspection included the adequacy and effectiveness of the licensee's emergency organization, emergency facilities, equipment and procedures, emergency tests and drills, main control room environmental system, fire brigade organization, means for determining a radioactive release, emergency training, and coordination of emergency planning activities with offsite support agencies. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector.

During the inspection, it was found that certain activities under your license appear to be in noncompliance with NRC requirements. These items and references to pertinent requirements are listed in the attached Notice of Violation. This notice is sent to you pursuant to the provisions of Section 2.201 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations. Section 2.201 requires you to submit to this office, within 20 days of your receipt of this notice, a written statement or explanation in replaceding: (1) corrective steps which have been taken by you, and the results achieved; (2) corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further noncompliance; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved.



During the inspection it was found that certain activities under your license appear to deviate from commitments to the Commission, from generally accepted practices in the industry and have safety significance. These items are identified in the enclosed Notice of Deviation. Please submit to this office within 20 days of your receipt of this letter, a written statement or explanation in reply including: (1) corrective steps which have been taken by you, and the results achieved; (2) corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further deviations; and (3) the date corrective actions were or will be completed.

In accordance with Section 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice", Part 2, Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, a copy of this letter and the enclosed inspection report will be placed in the NRC's Public Document Room. If this report contains any information that you (or your contractor) believe to be proprietary, it is necessary that you make a written application within 20 days to this office to withhold such information from public disclosure. Any such application must include a full statement of the reasons on the basis of which it is claimed that the information is proprietary, and should be prepared so that proprietary information identified in the application is contained in a separate part of the document. If we do not hear from you in this regard within the specified period, the report will be placed in the Public Document Room.

Should you have any questions concerning this letter, we will be glad to discuss them with you.
