RE: Midland Plant Units 1 and 2

We have reviewed your letter of March 2, 1976, transmitting the financial data for the fourth quarter of 1975, as had been requested by MR. Giambusso's letter of September 13, 1974.

We have reviewed the requirements established by the September 13, 1974 letter in light of your question regarding the necessity for further submittals and your request that you be relieved of any requirement for further reporting. We note that Company earnings improved each month during 1975 and that the earnings for the year were double those of 1974. Internally generated sources of funds in 1975 were 2-1/2 times the 1974 level. We further note that the Company announced, in December of 1975, the resumption of a normal construction program and that rate request decisions for both electricity and gas are expected momentarily. We conclude that there has been a significant improvement in the financial condition of the Company as compared to 1974.

We also have reviewed that portion of the September 13, 1974, letter relating to coverage of your quality assurance program in the special reports. We agree that normal audit and inspection activities by the Region III office of our Office of Inspection and Enforcement obviate the necessity of filing quality assurance information in the special reports.
