Dear Mr. Allen:

During the course of our review of your application for construction permits for the proposed Midland Plant, Units 1 and 2, we requested the comments and recommendations of the U. S. Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, concerning the radiological impact of the proposed facilities on the areas of responsibility of the Fish and Wildlife Service.

A copy of the Fish and Wildlife Service Report dated March 27, 1969, containing comments and recommendations on both radiological and nonradiological effects of your proposed reactors is enclosed for your information. Copies of this report are also being sent to appropriate state and local efficials. The radiological safety aspects of the material in this report will be considered in the evaluation of the safety of your project by the regulatory staff and by the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards. Our conclusions will be included in the safety evaluation which we prepare for the public hearing to be held to consider the issuance of construction permits for your proposed units.

We call your attention to the recommendations of the Fish and Wildlife Service as they relate to the Midland Plant Units 1 and 2. You will note the need for both preoperational and postoperational radiological surveys for the Midland Plant. These surveys should include the Tittabawassee River areas in the vicinity of the plant, the effects of the Midland Plant operation on the environment, and any special considerations because of the proposed use of the storage pond for plant condenser cooling during periods of low river flow.

The quest that you continue to cooperate with the Fish and Wildlife Service in the conduct of the requested surveys.

Athough we understand that plant effluents such as chemicals and heted water will not be discharged directly to the Tittabawassee River, we wish to call your attention to the Service's recommendations concerning such potential hazards to fish and wildlife resources and note that these may be of considerable importance in your consideramons of the Midland Plant Units 1 and 2 design and its effects on the environs. We urge that you give these recommendations full consideration. The substantive regulatory jurisdiction of the Atomic Energy Commission under present law, however, is limited essentially to matters of radiological health and safety and the common defense and scaurity, and we now lack authority to impose restrictions regarding thermal effects of the operation of licensed nuclear facilities.

The Water Quality Act of 1965 provides a comprehensive program through which quality standards are developed by the States and approved by the Secretary of the Interior. It is our understanding that the State of Michigan standards have been partially approved by the Secretary of the Interior, although this approval does not include temperature criteria for protection of fish, wildlife and other aquatic life.
