SUMMARY OF MEETING WITH CONSUMERS POWER COMPANY REGARDING MIDLAND PRESSURE VESSEL MATERIAL SURVEILLANCE PROGRAM

On February 24, 1977 the NRC staff met with representatives of the Consumers Power Company and Babcock & Wilcox. The meeting attendance is attached.

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the Midland Plant pressure vessel surveillance program and the manner in which the limited amount of archive material identified as WF-70 weld metal will be divided. The WF-70 is a weld material used in the beltline weld for the Midland Unit 1, Crystal River, Davis Besse pressure vessels. The amount of WF-70 available is a total of 107 inches of linear weld. This WF-70 archive material will be placed in Bonded Storage until the division and its use in a surveillance program has been decided.

Because of the limited amount of WF-70 material available and its similarity to WF-209 weld, except for the flux used, a program has been set up to provide a correlation between the WF-70 and WF-209 weld metal.

Consumers Power Company indicated they would provide the description of the Midland Units 1 and 2 Reactor Vessel Surveillance Program in the Final Safety Analysis Report, which will be submitted in late 1977. The use of WF-209 will be indicated as the weld metal for surveillance specimens subject to the successful correlation between WF-70 and WF-209 weld metal. The existing WF-70 weld metal will not be divided up for surveillance specimens until a plan, agreed upon by the NRC, Consumers Power Company and Babcock Wilcox has been reached. The staff indicated that no division of the WF-70 weld metal for speciment should be made until a well developed plan has been developed to maximize the use of the WF-70 material.
