


With respect to the second requested order, we believe that extending to March 22, 1971, the time for filing of interrogatories prepared by Saginaw Valley would constitute an unwarranted imposition on other parties to this proceeding and would unduly delay this proceeding. We also consider the requested extension of time to be unreasonable on its face and has not been sufficiently justified to warrant the granting of the requested order. However, in the case of this particular request (but without admitting that good cause for any extension of time has been shown by Saginaw Valley), we would not object to extending the period for the filing of Saginaw Valley's interrogatories for some more reasonable period of time such as 30 days.
