
Please refer to the complete file in this matter including your and Mr. Murphy's letters to me.

The Congress of the United States in creating the Atomic Energy Commission did not vest them with the power nor did the Congress grant any power to the commission to prevent the fulfillment of the duties of a citizen.

I, a citizen, request that I be accorded my rights since in my request of 12 November 1970 I met all the rules and regulations of the Atomic Energy Commission.
