174 Did you ever consider the possibility of fossil fuel plants with appropriate pollution controls instead of the proposed Midland Units? Explain your answer in detail and in light of your recent announcement to construct fossil fuel power plants to the north of Midland?

Answer: Applicant in the course of building any new unit for the production of electricity takes into account the various alternatives available to it. As discussed in applicant's Supplemental Environmental Report, the alternatives in the case of a base load unit are primarily limited to nuclear fuel and coal. The considerations involved and the reasons why a nuclear plant is considered the best alternative are discussed in detail in the Supplemental Environmental Report.

Applicant is not aware of any announcement in early 1971 to construct fossil fuel power plants north of Midland and in fact has no such plans.
