
I understand that the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards has recently released an Information Report on "Potential Threat to Licensed Nuclear Activities from Insiders." Members of my staff attended the recent briefing on this report.

I am particularly interested in the language in the second paragraph of page 5-29 which states:

"This source...recommends that the nuclear industry adopt a psychological profiling for selection and monitoring of key personnel, that supervisory personnel be trained to recognize warning indicators and even administer the tests, but that trained professionals be used for the assessment of test results."

Within applicable rules and regulations, I would greatly appreciate being kept informed of your efforts in implementing these recommendations.
