Dear Chairman Ahearne:

Except for a few radical groups, all leading scientists and nuclear experts have said that the accident at Three Mile Island did no harm to the public. This is hurting the customers financially.

I am asking you to use your power to get Three Mile Island Unit 1 back in operation as soon as possible. We need the energy for our standard of living. I, for one, do not want to go back to oil lamps, ice box refrigerators, etc. There have been enough hearings, committees, and public meetings which are nothing more than anti-nuke rallies.

Also, vent the Krypton 85 gas and get it over with.
