Today my husband and I were forced to make a decision about our future. This is a very unhappy time for us. We have decided to leave our home. We have lived in Middletown 34 yrs., all our lives. Our families and dear friends are here. This house we live in and wanted to raise our kids and grow old in will soon belong to someone else. I can't tell you how sad I feel.

But when we were forced to list our priority we found our children's health & safety first on that list.

To us that means putting more space between us & Three Mile Island. We don't even know where we're going because we never thought about living anywhere else.

I believed for a time that the Kemeny Commission & our Gov.'s Comm. would see to it that Three Mile

Island wouldn't threaten us again. We are finding the clean-up as upsetting as the accident. Met-Ed & the NRC, are both covering up so that the nuclear industry can proceed. I don't want all the plants closed just Three Mile Island, and I believe there has been proof that it shouldn't operate.

The facts are, during the clean-up, we will be exposed to ever more radiations, and given Met-Ed's track record the clean-up will not go on without mistakes, which we will pay for (health wise.)

I'm telling you this because I believe the people in Wash. who make decisions about our future don't know what it's really like living here. Put yourself in my place,
