Dear Mr. Rothfleisch:

In response to the comments in the subject Memorandum, the following responses are herewith provided:

- 1. Ogle Petroleum Inc. (OPI) has applied for permits for evaporation ponds from the State Engineer and will not construct the ponds until the permits are received.
- 2. As discussed in the Environmental Report and the DEQ application, the water supply for non-process activities (i.e., domestic water, sanitary supply, etc.) comes from a well permitted through the State Engineer's Office. For process activities (leaching and recovering uranium), the groundwater in the production zone (orebody) is used as the source of water supply. These are the production/injection well applications (T.F. No. U.W. 14-18-253) referred to in the Memorandum. It is not clear as to what water supply is referring to in the comment.

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Please contact me if there is any specific information that OPI can provide that will assist the NRC in responding to the State Engineer's Memorandum.
