

SUBJECT: Receipt of Radioisotopes

Normal shipments of radioisotopes:

From time to time, we will receive packages of radioisotopes as part of our normal supply shipments. These packages will be marked with an emblem similar to the one reproduced below. These packages should be delivered, unopened, to the Center within three hours of receipt. One of the individuals listed below or their designated representative should receive the package.

After hour deliveries:

During off-duty hours, if a package should be delivered, one of these individuals should be notified by phone of the receipt of the package. Notification should be attempted in the order listed.

Damaged shipments:

If a package appears to be damaged, judged by external examination, do not accept the shipment. Instead, contact the Radiation Safety Officer (Dr. Guthrie or Dr. Schaeffer) alerting him of the situation so that he may inspect the package for isotope leakage. Ask the driver to remain with his truck until the R.S.O. can determine whether contamination of the vehicle has occurred. If the driver cannot or will not remain until the R.S.O. can carry out this inspection, DO NOT ACCEPT THE SHIPMENT.
