Gentlemen:

This is the twenty-first 30 day "Pyproduct Material Transfer Report" which is due pursuant to Section IV, Item E, of the Order Modifying Licenses dated February 18, 1988. The content of this report, as were the contents of the previous reports, is in accordance with discussions with your staff on April 6, 1988. This report lists the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of 3M Brand Static Eliminator customers who our records show have not returned devices as of November 13, 1989, (status code 7 and 8). As discussed with Dr Bruce Mallett on several occasions this past year, the 30 day "Byproduct Material Transfer Report" does not include those devices reported as "lost" (status code 4).

This report is identical to the October 11, 1989 report. There have been no changes this month.

In addition to the 30 day "Byproduct Material Transfer Report", a "Status 4 (Lost) Device History Report" dated November 13, 1989 is enclosed. This report lists customers in alphabetical order and has important information notations regarding the status of the "lost" devices. The "Status 4 (Lost) Device History Report" is also essentially a duplicate of the one submitted on August 14, 1989. Since that date, only thirty devices have been found and returned to us. We expect some others will be found and returned to us in the future.

We are also providing you with an November 13, 1989 listing of "lost" devices which is alphabetical-by-state. However, that listing does not have important information notations regarding the status of "lost" devices. As discussed with Dr. Mallett and Mr. Lynch, our present computer program will not provide an alphabetical-by-state listing with the ginformation notations. Unfortunately, the alphabetical-by-state "lost" device listing has the title

"Byproduct Material Transfer Report" which is the same title as the 30 day report discussed in the first paragraph of this letter. The "lost" list can be distinguished from the 30 day report by the numerical code in the status column. The code is four (4) for "lost" devices.
