

I am a practicing nuclear medicine physician in Woodland Hills, California. I am deeply concerned over the revised 10 CFR 35 regulations governing the medical use of byproduct material. These regulations would significantly impact my ability to give good medical care. I urge you to adopt the American College of Nuclear Physicians/Society of Nuclear Medicine Petition for Rulemaking which will change the current restrictive regulations to allow me to practice nuclear medicine for the benefit of my patients.
