

This letter is to support the Petition for Rule making from the the American College of Nuclear Physicians and the Society of Nuclear Medicine. The proposed changes will allow both physicians and pharmacists to practice their professions.

The reinterpretation of license conditions for radiopharmacies and and regulations for nuclear medicine licenses severely restricts these professionals to practice their respective professions as intended. Currently, the Food and Drug administration allows for pharmacists to compound a drug as needed and physicians to use drugs for unapproved purposes to enhance patient treatment. Also all states regulate the practices of medicine and pharmacy.

A strict adherence to package inserts overly restricts pharmacists and hampers physicians in the diagnosis and treatment of the patient.


