As per our request in previous correspondence, Nuclear Medicin. Service has temporarily relocated the in vitro testing operation to Bldg. #11 to allow for asbestos removal and the installation of a sprinkler system in Bldg. #59. We now request permission to return to Bldg. #59 on or about August 8, 1989.

Nuclear Medicine Service will become fully operational with the demothballing of the scanners and the reoccupation of the laboratory area as noted in the license. All conditions of the license will be in force on return, including provisions for both scanning and in vitro testing.

A wipe test of the in vitro area in Bldg. #11 will be conducted after all equipment and sources have been returned to Bldg. #59.
