SUBJECT: GENERIC LETTER 83-28, ITEM 2.2.1, EQUIPMENT CLASSIFICATION
FOR ALL SAFETY-RELATED COMPONENTS, SOUTH TEXAS PROJECT,
UNITS 1 AND 2 (TAC NO. 63486)

Generic Letter 83-28, Item 2.2.1 required licensees and applicants to describe in detail their program for classifying all safety-related components other than reactor trip system components as safety-related on plant documents and in information handling systems that are used to control plant activities that may affect these components.

By letters dated June 28, 1985 (ST-HL-AE-1274), November 4, 1986 (ST-HL-AE-1776), and October 26, 1989 (ST-HL-AE-3187), Houston Lighting & Power Company submitted responses to Item 2.2.1. We have evaluated the responses and find them acceptable (see enclosure). Therefore, Item 2.2.1 of generic Letter 83-28 is considered complete.

It should be noted that Items 2.2.1 and 2.2.2 of Generic Letter 83-28 have been assigned the NRC Technical Assignment Control (TAC) number 63486. The TAC will remain open until Item 2.2.2 is closed as well.

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
