To Mr. Kennedy and staff:

This is in response to your request for public comment regarding the Title transfer of Low Level Radioactive Waste (LLRW) and the related issue of on-site storage of LLRW.

If the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) concludes that LLRW is too dangerous for generators to monitor and contain on-site on a long term basis, then the LLRW would equally be too dangerous to dump anywhere else.

If the NRC concludes that LLRW is not too dangerous for long term on-site storage, then the NRC should allow it to happen.

Who should be held responsible for the problems created by nuclear waste? The people who make it.

If the nuclear generators are unable or unwilling to retain title and responsibility of the nuclear waste they create, then they should stop creating the waste.

If the nuclear generators need to continue generating nuclear waste, then they need to be held accountable by retaining title to the radioactive waste.
