Dear Ms Shanaman:

I urge you to do everything in your power to expedite the return of Three Mile Island Unit 1 to safe operation as quickly as possible. After all, this unit was not damaged in the Three Mile Island accident on March 28, 1979, and could be returned to operation in short order to produce the energy we need so badly and to cut down the consumption of oil which I am sure is being used in the generation of some of the electric power that General Public Utilities Corp. is at present being forced to purchase from other utilities because Three Mile Island Unit 1 is shut down. There has been some talk on GPU taking bankruptcy proceedings. This would not be in anyone's best interest, and could be made more remote by returning the undamaged unit to operation quickly, thereby alleviating the monumental financial problems confronting current management, and at the same time decrease the use of oil as mentioned above, with all its associated benefits.
