Subject Comments on IAEA Draft Safety Guides Review Request (SG-06 and SG-G6)

There is nothing in the subject guides that conflicts with current U.S. policy. The material is purposely very broad in scope to permit membered states to tailor the Guides to their specific needs.

I reviewed NUREG-0610 "Emergency Action Level Guidelines" to determine if it could be incorporated into IAEA Safety Guide SG-06 "Preparedness of the Operating Organization (Licensee) for Emergencies at Nuclear Power Plants." NUREG-0610 has been developed for nuclear power reactors typically used in the United States. Any attempt to modify it to fit into the IAEA Safety Guide format and still retain its identity would be very difficult if not impossible.

NUREG-0610 could be added to Safety Guide SG-06 as an annex thus allowing other organizations access to and use of those portions applicable to their operations.
