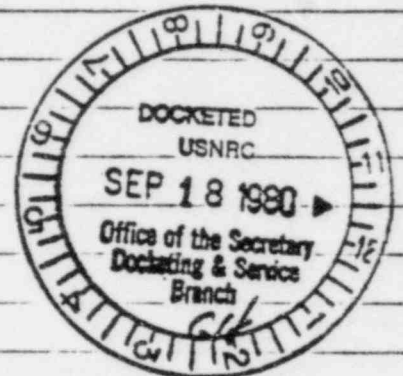

RE: Resumption of GESMO

Dear sir/madam,

I support the resumption of the GESMO proceedings. The main reason for suspending the hearings, i.e. the INFCE evaluation, is now completed.

The White House apparently still wishes to suspend GESMO since a favorable response could clear the way towards recycling, against the Administration's non-proliferation policies. I do not believe there to be sufficient reason for the NRC to reevaluate recycling on a technical/environmental basis since

- 1) Unfavorable conclusions (re. recycling) will be in Administration's favor, anyway.
- 2) Favorable technical/environmental conclusions clearly place the burden on political issues, on which any Administration should be prepared to set clear and consistent policy.
- 3) The present Administration's non-proliferation policy has already shown itself to be hastily contrived and inconsistent (witness the present Indian fuel controversy), and the NRC should feel no concern over their impact (at least at the GESMO stage).
