The comments in your September 8, 1980 letter regarding Colorado's radioactive materials regulatory program have been noted, and the following response is offered:


1. The license for Joy Manufacturing Company will be reviewed.
2. The license for Kaman Sciences had been reviewed after your last inspection; a complete updated application was submitted. This application had been reviewed, and our comments back to Kaman were in for typing during the inspection of Messrs. McGrath and Gordon.
3. It is our intent for supervisory personnel to conduct field evaluations of inspectors.
4. We are in the process of writing procedures for handling escalated enforcement actions.
5. We do attempt to issue enforcement correspondence within 30 days of the inspection.
6. We concur that incident reports should indicate the status of the incident and also enforcement actions if applicable.
