(3) Physical Security Plan

The approved security plan consists of documents withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790, entitled "University of Utah Physical Security Plan for Protection of SNM of Low Strategic Significance under Licenses R-25 and R-126," as follows:

Revision 1 dated July 28, 1980, submitted with letter dated August 11, 1980.

3. The license amendment is effective 30 days from the date of its issuance.
