This letter is to request on behalf of the Center for Development Policy (CDP) pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (50 U.S.C. Sec. 552, as amended) the following information including, but not limited to the following:

- 1.) A PSAR or a PSIR on Taiwan Power Nuclear Units 7 and 8.
- 2.) Any and all reports, memoranda, correspondence, scientific test results, cost-benefit analyses, and other documents pertaining to the design, siting and/or consideration of Taiwan Power Nuclear Units 7 and 8, not already available in the Public Documents Room. Licences have been applied for by the General Electric Company (Application No. XR-135, Docket No. 11001075; Application No. XSNM01662, Docket No. 11001076) and the Westinghouse Electric Corporation (Application No. XR-136, Docket No. 11002058).

I request that any records located as a result of your search be made available for inspection and copying. At the time they are made available, it will be determined whether it is necessary to reproduce any of them. If you determine that some or all of the records are exempt from release under FOIA, please notify me in writing which exceptions you believe cover the materials you are not releasing, and make available the remainder of the records to the extent that they are "reasonably segregable", in accordance with the FOIA, from the records you have determined to be exempt.

CDP is a research and education project of the International Center and has a continuing interest in the rational extension of technology, particularly abroad. This request on their behalf is, therefore, "in the public interest, because furnishing the information can be considered as primarily benefiting the general public" and any applicable fees should be waived as permitted by the Act. In the event that a search is required and you are unwilling to waive search fees, I would appreciate your advising me in advance. CDP's need for information requested by this letter is urgent.

If you have any questions concerning this request, please contact me by telephone in order to expediate matters. Otherwise, I will expect to receive a reply from you within ten (10) work-
