SUBJECT: REVIEW OF DELEGATIONS OF AUTHORITY AND OTHER DOCUMENTATION

The transfer of functions and reporting requirements called for by Reorganization Plan No. 1 of 1980 will bring about changes in current delegations of authority of most organizational components of the NRC staff. There will also be a number of internal procedures and documents which will be rendered inaccurate by the transfer of functions and responsibilities.

Therefore:

- OGC 1. Staff should review the delegations of authority for all offices other than those now reporting to the Commission and prepare updated delegations as appropriate for the Chairman's review: (EDO/OGC) (SECY Suspend: 60 days)
- OGC 2. Staff should review the delegations of authority for all offices reporting directly to the Commission and prepare updated delegations as appropriate for Commission review: (OGC/OPE) (SECY Suspend: 30 days)
3. Staff should conduct a review of all documents, procedures, manual chapters, rules and other published materials which may need revision and prepare for the Chairman a schedule for updating these documents: (EDO) (SECY Suspend: 90 days)
4. Staff should conduct a review of current internal Commission procedures and identify areas where modification would be appropriate for implementation of the Reorganization Plan: (SECY) (SECY Suspend: 30 days)
