Dear NRC,

We've been informed by the news we hear on the radio that we - the public - have 15 days to express our feelings on the proposed releases of more krypton gas from T.M.I.

We are most upset and concerned about this. My husband and I are expecting our first baby any day now, and we are quite worried that our baby will have to begin his life being bombarded with radiation. Multiply our feelings by the thousands of people who live here, and you will have your public feelings about the releases.

Undoubtedly you will say that the releases planned are miniscule and will pose no threat. Haven't you been following the announcements being made by doctors and scientists who now feel that they can no longer assure us that even small amounts of radiation are not harmful?

We live here, own homes here, work here, are raising our families here. We can't pack up and move to some less dangerous spot. We are truly between the proverbial rock and hard place. It is up to you to get us out of here.

~~Please~~, ~~Please~~, before you give Met Ed permission to release any more krypton gas, think - would any of you, your wives & children want to live in this area while more releases are

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being made?

None of us can presume to tell you how to handle the clean-up of the reactor - but we can implore you for the sake of our health - both physical and mental - not to allow the release of any more radioactive gasses. There must be some other way. Please find it.
