Your letter of September 29, 1980, requested that the MRC conduct a study on the effects of an oil spill near the intake structure of the Carolina Power and Light Company's Brunswick Steam Electric Plant. You requested that we keep you informed of our efforts with regard to this study.

Such a study was initiated by the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation on September 15, 1980, after we were informed of the Brunswick Energy Company's plans to build an oil refinery near the nuclear power plant on the Cape Fear River. We subsequently requested Carolina Power and Light Company to study potential impacts of operation of the oil refinery on the safety of the Brunswick Nuclear Plant. When the study is provided by Carolina Power and Light Company its adequacy will be analyzed by the Siting Analysis Branch in the Division of Engineering. As a minimum, a review of the following areas will be performed by the Branch:

- 1. The impact of this new use of the waterways on safe plant operation;=
- 2. Carolina Power and Light's authority over the activities on the waterways as related to the designated exclusion area; and
- 3. Identification and evaluation of potential accidents involving hazardous materials or activities in the vicinity of the plant.

vo. The object of our study is to determine whether the proposed oil refinery will adversely impact the continued safe operation of the Brunswick facility. Compensatory measures will be required as appropriate, based on the conclusions of the study. We will provide you with a copy of the study, which is scheduled to be completed prior to operation of the oil refinery.
