## SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN

- In Article III Consideration, the sum "\$433,293.00" is substituted for the sum "\$ 375,019.00".

## Article A-I RESEARCH TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR

(a) The scope of work under this contract is unclassified and shall be in accordance with Contractor's proposal entitled, "Seismological and Geological Studies of the Nemaha Uplift Region - Oklahoma"

Continue to conduct detailed microearthquake studies.

Continue to operate the eleven station seismic network which includes the Tulsa observatory, seven semipermanent volunteer-operated and three radio-telemetry stations.

Reduce microearthquake data obtained from the network and attempt to determine the relationship between saismicity and structure.

Coordination results with those obtained from earthquake studies in Kansas. Nebraska and Iowa.

Complete gravity and magnetic information from studies conducted along the Nemaha in Oklahoma.
