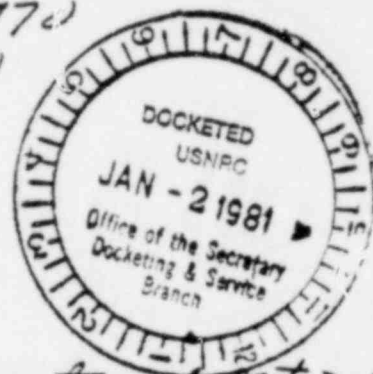

Gentlemen,

Re the Federal Register notice of Oct. 27 (45 FR 70874) I ask you not to permit the recycling of scrap metals contaminated with Technetium-98 and uranium for subsequent use in consumer articles.

I am aware that you consider such radioactive contamination as low level but no matter how small the health hazards to the public there can be no assurance that future generations would not be affected. Yes there would probably be financial savings but is this the kind of economy that the American consumer would welcome. And by the way would you not have to insist upon a health warning on all products so contaminated. What would be the chances of selling cooking utensils, appliances, toys labeled: WARNING: This product emits low level radiation.
