In preparation for the tour of TMI scheduled for October 14, 1980, enclosed is a Met Ed memorandum describing Licensee's plans which we are providing as well as to all parties and other participants in the proceeding.

The memorandum may be helpful in terms of identifying time to be allotted, suggested dress, information which Licensee will require of those who participate, and the TMI facilities to be seen. The plans accommodate up to 40 total people who for ease and security reasons will be divided into three tour

groups. The Board has advised Licensee that it will have six participants in the tour. We anticipate that all six Board representatives would tour in one group, that one Licensee representative and one NRC staff representative would tour with each group, and that the two representatives of each intervening party or state participant would be divided as equally as possible between the three groups.

The tour focuses on Unit 1 but includes as well the Unit 2 control 1 om. Entering Unit 1's containment was considered but rejected. A containment entry would involve a complete change into and out of special clothing and require pre- and post-whole body counts which for each individual takes 10-15 minutes and for a group of this size would involve hours of waiting time.



September 16, 1980 Date

This is the agenda for the ASLB Tour scheduled for October 14, 1980, at 2:00 P.M. As proposed, this tour would take approximately 4½ hours. It does not include entry into Unit I containment building as it would take an additional several hours for processing and entry for only one hour of time actually inside the containment building.

Individuals participating in this tour should dress comfortably with women wearing slacks and low-heeled closed toe shoes. Each person will be requested to provide proof of identification to security personnel.

Arrive at TMI Observation Center 2:00 P.M.

- A. Security Badging
 - 1. Proof of identity required
 - 2. Information recorded by security guard
 - 3. Issue escort required badges to individuals
- B. TLD's
 - 1. Individuals will be requested to complete the required forms necessary for issuance of TLD's. This information includes social security number, birthdate, address, age, etc.
 - 2. Record number of TLD on each individual's completed form and issue personal dosimetry
- C. Security Briefing
 - 1. Guard will inform group of security regulations and requir ments.
- D. Group Assignments
 - 1. Large group will be divided into 3 smaller groups and individuals will remain with their designated group throughout the remaining activities.

- 3:00 P.M. Depart Observation Center
- 3:15 P.M. Arrive at north Processing Center on TMI
 - A. Individuals will proceed through the electronic detection equipment and will also be subject to a hands-on pat-down search by a security guard of the same sex.
- 3:30 P.M. Proceed to the identified locations on the tour route. Groups A B C will be rotated to each location at specified intervals. (See attached rotation schedule) The identified locations and time allotment for discussion are as follows:

 - B. Intermediate Building auxiliary feedwater and hydrogen recombiner 20 minutes
 - C. Operations Center HP Lab 10 minutes
 - D. Technical Support Center 10 minutes
 - E. Containment Building Model 15 minutes

 - G. Unit I Control Room 20 minutes
 - H. Unit 2 Control Room 10 minutes
