Dear Dr. Drum:

Your letter of August 15, 1989, suggested that Brigham and Women's Hospital may not be prepared to handle contaminated accident victims because of previous NRC citations and evaluations of your operational safety program. Past NRC inspections of your operational safety program focused on your ability to safely handle radioactive materials. The citations you received were for inadequate administrative controls, such as inventory and control of sealed radioactive sources, inadequate surveys, and inadequate control of your film badge program. The findings do not lead us to conclude that there are any serious problems with your materials program that would significantly impact on your ability to treat contaminated accident victims.

It is true that the NRC and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) require letters of agreement with hospitals that provide support to states and utilities in the event of a nuclear power incident. The requirements for this support are contained in FEMA document MS-1, Medical Services. An evaluation of your ability to treat contaminated accident victims would be performed by FEMA. This evaluation is normally performed once every six years. As yet, there has been no evaluation by FEMA concerning this issue at your hospital.
