Subject: Seabrook Station Maintenance Backlog

Gentlemen:

In the January 18, 1990 Commission Briefing, New Hampshire Yankee (NHY) committed to provide information regarding certain maintenance items in response to a request from Chairman Carr. The requested information is provided below.

The oldest outstanding work request at Seabrook Station was initiated December 30, 1985. This priority 3 work request concerns an alarm in the non-safety-related water treatment system that would not clear when the temperature was in the normal band. An engineering change document specified replacing a solenoid in the system. The specified replacement was discontinued by the manufacturer. Engineering review of this item has been completed and the engineering change document which specifies an appropriate replacement is in process of being issued.

The oldest outstanding safety-related work request was initiated on February 4, 1987. This priority 3 work request concerns a required mechanical joint inspection for a letdown heat exchanger relief valve (CS-V319). Field work was completed for this work request on September 2, 1989, however, the required visual inspection at pressure cannot be completed until the unit is in MODE 3.
